As the senior Designated Safeguarding Lead in school, I want to make sure that I share helpful resources and advice with you about keeping our children safe.

In this Windmill Weekly, I'd like you to know that I am concerned about the age at which children are given mobile phones and the permissions that they seem to have with them.

I personally have not given my children mobile phones until they are in secondary school.

I do not let my children use social media until they reach the recommended ages.

The age guidance for Snapchat, Instagram, WhatsApp, YouTube and Tiktok is 13.

The main situation where we hear of bullying allegedly taking place is on phones/tablets.


Term Dates:
